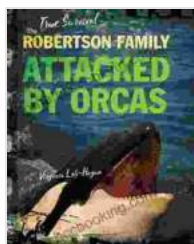


The Robertson Family Attacked by Killer Whales: A True Story of Survival

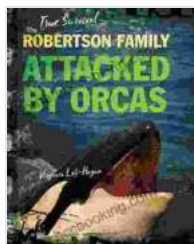

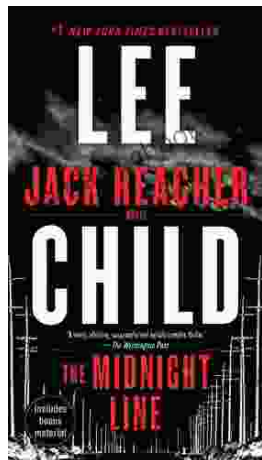
