When icing is called, the play is stopped and a face-off is held outside the attacking zone, usually in the neutral zone. The team that caused the icing is penalized by having to defend the face-off in their own zone.

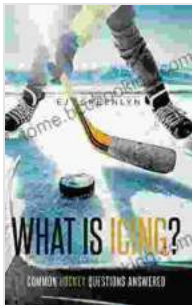

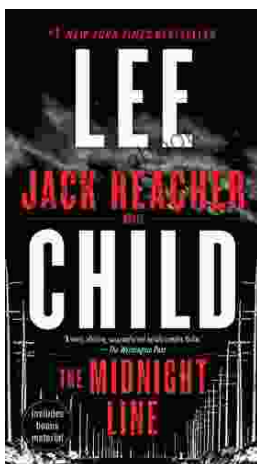
